

Because of this, I feel a 'Public Service Announcement' is in order and want all of you to know the following symptoms:


- The sudden appearance of many floaters floaters are normal as you age many floaters are not
- Flashes of light in one or both eyes
- Blurred vision
- Gradually reduced side (peripheral) vision
- A curtain-like shadow over your visual field

A detached retina is considered a medical emergency and if you cannot get in to see an Ophthalmologist that day, then you need to go to an emergency room. The sooner they can treat it the better. Lisa Erlandson is a compulsive quilt collector whose habit has led to several quilt-related specialties.

She is an AQS Certified Appraiser of Quilted Textiles, lecturer, quilt show

judge, teacher and quilt historian. She also owns Le Retreat House in Gainesville, Texas.

Lisa has an extensive collection of antique quilts that she shares during many of her lectures. She has spoken internationally and teaches and lectures at venues from small local guilds to national quilt shows. She also judges quilt shows ranging from county fairs to statewide shows. She is a past president of the American Quilt Study Group.


Lisa wrote the pattern instructions for quilts made by AQSG members and published in the 2013 book *Revival! A Study of Early 20th Century Colonial Revival Quilts* published by Kansas City Star Books. She served as the designer for the latest AQSG book, *In War Time: A Study of Civil War Era Quilts 1850 - 1865*.

I was delighted to see a few young women at retreat this year. I hope to see more in the future. If there is a young man or woman that you know who has expressed any interest in sewing, I hope you will take the time to nurture them. There could not be a better Guild activity than inspiring the next generation of Guild members.

I hope those of you who attended retreat are still riding the wave of contentment and inspiration, I know I am. I love sewing in a group and sewing in public. Community Service

If you were at the guild meetings in the last few months you may have been a bit confused as to why someone from The Children's Advocacy Center and Isabel's Community Outreach spoke to us. Well, it's because we thought you might want to know more about these wonderful organizations to which we donate the quilts and other items we make.

There are so many different charities that are worthy of our time and efforts. It is often hard to keep our list small. I am contacted frequently by groups who would love to have our quilts, or who want us to make other items, (like fidget quilts for Alzheimer's patients, memory bears, pillowcase dresses, etc). I have to remind myself that we are already stretched as thin as our membership can go!

One of the organizations that we donate to is the Plano Children's Medical Clinic. This is a nonprofit organization that offers healthcare to low-income families in Plano. Right now we don't give them quilts. Mostly we donate flannel receiving blankets that are made by high school and college students and me. (I teach them how, and they receive volunteer hours). We've also given them knitted baby caps and little "taggie" quilts.

The flannel for these blankets has come from a huge donation to the guild several years ago. Well, I am almost to the bottom of that donation! What's left are maybe a dozen yards of ugly, low quality floral flannels. So, I'm asking you all to look in your fabric stash for cute kid friendly flannels that you know you are never going to use. It takes two coordinating yards to make one receiving blanket. And, if you pull that fabric out and then have the sudden desire to sew it up yourself, that would be fantastic, too! You can easily do it in about 45 minutes. I am working on putting the instructions up on the website, but they are not there yet. I will bring copies to the meeting.

Also, I know Aggie could use flannel donations for the "cuddle" quilts, and she can use smaller, fat quarter size pieces. And, as always, thanks so much for all you do to serve our community, both within the guild and on your own! See you soon

The Quilters' Guild of East Texas, from Tyler brought their raffle quilt, "Home is where the Heart is". It has won several ribbons from area quilt shows.

Membership Diane Florence and Jeanne Vogel reported there were 66 members plus 2 new members and 9 visitors who attended. Tonight everyone received a door prize: a gift certificate from Rockin Bobbin quilt store in Dallas. A drawing was done for a gift certificate from Not Your Mama's Quilt Store.

Programs Peggy Burrell and Dena Smith reported our Barn Quilt workshop on Saturday is full.

However there is still space available to sign up for other workshops.

Community Service LaDawn Dalley delivered quilts to each of the groups we support. Aggie Meszaros reported delivering cuddle quilts (18" X 22") in January 27 quilts and February 61 quilts.

We had several lovely quilts shared during the Show N Tell.

Donna Petrick announced **TAQG** Rally day will be July 8 this year. The speaker/instructor will be Cynthia LeBlanc Regone. The **TAQG** table has meal tickets, pre-rally day raffle tickets and pins for sale. Sign-up sheets for the workshops are at the TAQG table for the Thursday and Friday in Mesquite before rally day and/or Arlington workshops on the following Monday and Tuesday after rally day.

After a brief break we reconvened for a delightful, informative program by Suzi Parron Smith, the Barn Quilt Lady. We dismissed at 8:15.



Board Meeting Minutes

2/6/ 2017 Tino's Too, Plano submitted by Denise Green

The meeting was called to order by President Pam Wingate. Those in attendance were Pam Wingate, Jane Schwarz, Jeanne Vogel, Diana Florence, Dena Smith, Peggy Burrell, LaDawn Dalley, Kena Leszcynski, Tina Connolly, Denise Green, Rose Davis and John Worley.

The Minutes from the meeting of 9 Jan were corrected and approved. The Treasurer's Report was approved as published.

Pam reported that it appears Lizzie Bailey is going to resign as secretary and we will need to fill that position soon. Lisa Ownby has also resigned as V-P of Programs.

Kena made the motion that the Minutes of the Board meetings be removed from the newsletter and post them in PDF format for members only to view. Dena seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Vice-president Reports

Finance - Jane distributed current financial reports for each committee, showing their groups income and expenses. She also brought copies of the complete budget for review. Jane reported the guild leadership met with her and our treasurer to review the books, noting we only have an excess of approximately \$35,000. It was recommended that no large donations be made until after the annual guilt show. At that time we can revisit the idea of making cash donations to one of the charities we now assist.

Diana made the motion to remove the complete financial report from the newsletter, but post it on the web site in PDF format for members only. The motion was seconded by Kena. Motion passed. An abbreviated form of monthly income and outgo may be published.

Jane reminded all that there is an expense form on our web site. Sign in, then go to Members; Documents; then select Guild forms in the drop box, there they are listed for our use. This form with receipts in an envelope makes for easier bookkeeping

Membership - Jeanne and Diana led a discussion about the room set up at our new location. Some adjustments will be made to facilitate traffic flow and still allow everyone to visit every table/station with information for the members and guests. The exterior doors of the building will be locked at 7:30 (you can go out, but not reenter). This is for safety and to allow our membership committee to enjoy the monthly programs. We now have a lapel mic for our club's

use. It was suggested we take a ten minute break after the business, before the speaker at each meeting. This will allow people to visit tables they missed upon entering. Having a "Put & Take" table was put on hold until after the retreat. Might try this every 3 months? Leftover items could be donated to Isabel's.

Programs -Dena and Peggy are already working on speakers for 2017 and 2018. There was a brief discussion about contracts with these speakers and cancellation fees as well as meal allowances. The board approved a maximum of \$40 per day.

Education -Kena has emailed all of the feedback information to the demonstration teachers from the last quilt show. She is also going to place all of that information (PDF format) in an "education folder" on Drop Box. Sara Lindsay will be assisting Kena at the show this year. Debbie Skorepa will again work with the Children's area at our show. The Education web site will be updated soon

Media -Tina will be marking all unpaid members as inactive. She will also try to place the Amazon Smile link on our Face Book page.

Committee Reports

Sunshine and Shadows - Pat Wiant should be notified of any member needing a greeting card from the guild.

TAQG John reported for Sherry that the March meeting will be about community service.

John asked photos of club activities to be placed in the Drop Box so he will also have access to them as our historian and editor

Quilt Show - Rose requested photos of Bees and Minnies to be posted on the website. Raffle tickets will be available at Thursday's meeting and each member should sell at least one bundle of tickets as a part of their membership responsibility. Book marks will be ready to take to area guilt stores. Post cards will be mailed to area quilters. Expenses have gone up this year so our ticket prices are also going up, as well as Vendor prices and workers lunch prices. Sponsor fees have remained the same. QGP is going to have a store at the show and will be selling t-shirts, mugs and other items

Rose also reported we have two security officers who will patrol the facility at all times when open. After these officers secure it for the night, it will be patrolled by Plano Centre and the Plano Police Dept.

With Pam having to leave early, Rose adjourned the meeting.
