Join us on Thursday, April 13th to hear our own guild member, Rose-Clair Fletcher. She will speak on *Portraits in Thread and Pencils*.

Rose-Clair has provided biographic information below:

"I was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and came to Texas when my husband left the Air Force in 1988. I have a Bachelor's Degree in Art Education and an Associate Degree in Graphic Design.

"When I was little I watched my grandmother sew on her treadle sewing machine. She could look at a picture of a dress in the Sears Catalog and sit down and make it. I started sewing as soon as I could pick up a needle and not stab myself. I quilted a few things after having kids, but believe me, they were nothing to get excited about!

"Then my son Todd married Tiffany, the daughter of Linda V. Taylor of Linda's Electric Quilters, which introduced me to "real" quilting. (I have been working at LEQ since 2007 as a graphic designer, designing ads, newsletters, digitizing patterns, and making some of my own.)

"A friend of mine introduced me to Art Quilts, and I really enjoy making them. At first I made quilts based on a theme - "Cinderella's Night at The Ball," "Robin Hood," and "The Princess and the Pea." They took so long to make - 2½ years for Cinderella - that I wanted to make some that would not take as long so I could make more than a hand full in the next 10 years. I then tried portrait quilts, which I love and have been doing ever since.



"I'm also a member of Art Quilters of Plano, which is a part of the Quilters Guild of Plano. You can see our display at the Quilt Plano Show. I believe I joined the Quilters Guild of Plano in 2004. I enjoy making the graphics for ads, designing show T-Shirts and pins for the Guild. I also love the friendship of the members and small groups and classes."

Those who attended last month's meeting saw Rose-Clair's beautiful quilts. On Saturday, April 15th, Rose-Clair will offer a workshop on *Portraits in Thread and Pencils*.

The Color of Light

I'm starting with the obvious: Light comes in many colors.

The color of the light striking an object affects what color that is "observed". Imagine you are looking at what appears to be a blue ball floating in front of a black background. With this little information, we could either be looking at a blue ball lit with white light or we could be looking at a white ball lit with blue light. Luckily most scenes are not this limited, and consist of many different colors of things we recognize.

Our vision system is fascinating. It does many things to simplify the many complicated sights so our brain can process thoughts efficiently. Imagine that you go outside and pick up a red ball. The sun goes behind a dark cloud and (voila!) the ball turns purple. You walk in the kitchen and (voila!) the ball turns orange. It might be a bit disconcerting, right?

Our vision system "color corrects" so we don't get confused by things like this. Had you taken photos of the ball, you would see that it really does "change colors".





The left photo was taken of a print, under incandescent light. The right image was corrected on my PC (one button – make the white stripes on the neck look white). The original really does look like the right image (to me) under any light source.

The photos of a pair of quilts below were taken about 4 minutes apart. In the left photo, the sun was out fully in a blue sky. (In this case, the rendered colors are more accurate: the yellow sunlight is balanced by the blue skylight, making white light.) In the right photo, the sun went behind a small, but dark cloud. (Here, blue skylight overpowered the filtered sunlight, leaving a blue tint, almost eliminating yellow from the quilts.)






↓ Sun Behind a Small Dark Cloud in Blue Sky




Notice the difference is the color of the garage door on the right. Photos taken in the shade (whether the sun is behind a small dark cloud or the subject is under a shade tree) will tend to have a bluish tint.

Look at the shadow area in the following images. In the center image, I brightened only the shadow to match the brightness of the sunlit walkway. Notice how much more blue (and less red) the brightened shadow area became. In the right image, I added reds and yellows to the shaded area only. Notice how well the colors match the original.

The original partial quilt photo below left was taken at Market Hall without flash. (Flash is also white light.) Market Hall has fluorescent lights (with something called a Green-Magenta shift). I was asked to fix the colors. I had the quilt available, and could see that anything I did to balance the colors affected the white areas (which were fine in the original) as well. I had to carefully select all of the discolored magenta and correct only it.

The photos below right are from Quilt Plano a few years ago. The quilts in the foreground are illuminated by the camera flash, and the colors are fine. But notice the colors in the lights on the ceiling. They all looked white at the time. But Plano Centre must use what bulbs that are available to replace burned out ones.

Dog Beds from Community Service

A friend recently suggested another use for tee shirts that you can't give away due to the logo on the shirt. Either cut out the logo and then sew closed the tee shirt on 1,2 or 3 sides, depending on where you had to cut off logos. Ex: cut the logo off on the on the upper chest. Sew closed the two arm holes and top of the shirt below the cut off logo. Preceed to fill the body of the shirt with cut off portions of quilts. When full, sew closed the bottom edge of the tee shirt. A little different way to use both trimming from the quilts and get rid of tee shirts that you can't give away. Or you can sew closed the neck and armhole holes of the tee shirt, turn the shirts wrong side out, stuff and sew closed the bottom of the shirt. The dogs and cats will not care which side is out.

I will continue to deliver the finished dog beds to the animal shelter, but I do need each of you to complete your own project. Thanks to all of you who help with this project.

General Meeting Minutes

March 9, 2017


