# Programs

At our June meeting, we will welcome **Alice Kolb who will present a Trunk Show with an emphasis on Wearables**. Alice has a MS in Home Economics, Clothing, and Textiles. She has written books and articles on threadwork, crazy quilting, embellishment, and Sashiko by machine.



We will have 2 workshops with Alice Kolb. On Friday, June 9<sup>th</sup>, she will teach *Stitch a Connection - Sashiko* 

Adapt traditional methods of Japanese quilting to machine stitches in a very SIMPLE technique. Using age-old designs you will translate the beauty of old world stitches to your personal style and taste and make yardage suited to totebags, hats, jacket beginnings, pillows or quilt blocks. Class focus is on pattern design and continuous line quilting, sewn with thick threads. It sews fast and easy and is such fun.

On Saturday June 10<sup>th</sup>, she will teach *Tiny Treasures - A Small Art Piece* 

Focus on color and embellishment in a small patched square of simple piecing. Class emphasis is based on experimental uses of color relationships and combinations of hand and machine embellishment. Ideal turned into a small needle/thread case for take-as-you-go stitching.

In July MJ Fielek will present a lecture on Making Beautiful Quilts Out of Simple Shapes. There will be no workshops in July.

# Quilt Plano 2017

Our May Guild meeting was our official Show Kick-off meeting. We had a great turn-out with individuals already starting to sign-up to help make Quilt Plano 2017 a great show! There are many opportunities for volunteers. Sign-ups will continue through our July meeting.

Here is some helpful information:

- I hope all of you are busy preparing your quilts for this year's show. Remember June 8<sup>th</sup> is the deadline for your entry. A color photo needs to be included with your entry paperwork. You only need to have the top completed by June 8<sup>th</sup>. You will have until August 8<sup>th</sup> at 1PM to have it quilted, labeled, bound and delivered to the Plano Event Center.
- We had a great turn-in of mini-quilts, but we still want more. You still have time – deadline for entry is at our July Guild meeting (July 13<sup>th</sup>).
- This year we will have (3) Guild Tables: Raffle Quilt and Membership, Programs and our *NEW* Guild Store. We have 2-hour volunteer slots for each table. These are important volunteer opportunities because you are the "Face of Quilt Plano 2017", greeting and answering questions as attendees enter the show as well as working your booth.
- This year we are adding an extra step to our set-up procedure, making sure all our quilts are well taken care of. We are asking for extra volunteers that will be placed around the perimeter of the quilts being judged to help us limit access to the area. This is a great opportunity for those that want to have a cool comfortable seat while volunteering. After all the quilts are hung, we will tape off the entire area and only individuals with a "special pin" will be able to enter

the area. These volunteer slots are under "Security" and are 2-hour on both Wednesday and Thursday.

# **TAQG** News



# **More Properties of Light**

Two months ago, in my article on **The Color of Light**, I pointed out some color problems we face in our photos. If you find them, many of those color problems can be corrected with a good Photo Editing program. (Notice, though, that I didn't say it would be easy! (2))

This article will discuss other properties of light that can affect our photos – and these factors cannot necessarily be corrected with an editing program. We are forced to recognize these types of situations and find ways to work around them.

The sun is *huge*! It is 864,938 miles across. (*Yes, I looked it up.*) But it is also 93,000,000 miles away. As a light source, direct sunlight is considered to be a point source. A point source is a light that is small compared to the distance it is away and it can leave a harsh shadow.

An overcast sky is an example of diffused light. Diffused light comes from a source that is much larger (than a point source) compared to the distance it is away and it tends to leave no shadow. This is a great condition for taking photos in a garden, where the lack of shadows allows the beauty and colors of the flowers come out without shadows.

#### Are Shadows Ever Any Good?

Sometimes we *want* shadows! In order to see the quilting of a quilt (unless it is a contrasting color, of course), you will more easily want to see shadows along the depressed lines of quilting. (The shadows and highlights are caused by the light working around the puffed out area between quilting lines.) Many surface textures can be shown in photographs using this method.


The left quilt photo below was taken at a previous Quilt Plano using the camera built-in flash. The right photo was taken with the quilt hanging in Linda Neal's back yard, lit by the sun, overhead to the left. Both light sources are point sources; the only difference being the angle relative to the quilt front.



The left photo shows no hint of the quilting. Interestingly, the white on white (circles in the) background fabric is quite visible. (I told Linda that she can *never* use white on white fabric again; at least not if I am supposed to try to photograph it. We'll see if she listens to me. <sup>(C)</sup>)

The right photo shows the quilting quite well; the sunlight coming from the above left results in a highlight on the top left side of the puffs between quilting lines, with a slight shadow on the bottom right side of those puffs.

As noted, the sun is a point source (and causes shadows), while the light from the sky in general is a diffused light source. The diffused light fills in to soften the shadows somewhat so that the shadows aren't as harsh. Without the light from the sky in general, the shadows would be dark and harsh indeed – and would probably be too distracting. (Notice how harsh the shadows are the next set of photos.) The following photos (provided by one of my students) show some shadows. The left photo has very little shadowing; the center photo has shadows below the hat brim; and the right photo has shadows to the left of the doll.



First, I will note the color differences. The left photo was using two external lamps, and resulting in a yellowish tint and loss of blues in the background. (Remember my previous article.) The two lamps were on opposite sides of the doll, basically eliminating shadows, with one filling in most of any shadow that would be caused by the other.

The other photos were using the camera built-in flash. The center photo was taken in landscape mode (with the flash above the camera lens as shown in the drawing below the photo). This resulted in shadows only below the large hat brim. The right photo was taken in portrait mode (with the camera rotated on its side, and the flash beside the lens). This resulted in shadows beside the doll.

The student had asked me why there were shadows in the right photo, just having turned the camera on its side. (The student hadn't noticed the shadows below the hat brim in the center photo.) Being slightly distracted at the time, I hadn't noticed the small shadows in the center photo, and was a bit disconcerted. Eventually I focused my mind, and saw the center photo shadows. I suppressed a smirk, and explained things.

#### Think Before You Shoot

That student's question makes a key point: You won't always see where any shadows might be before taking a photo. (*It would be great if we could turn the flash on for a moment to see the shadows. Wouldn't it?*)

Shadows – or the lack of shadows – and the location of those shadows are some of those things that we just might need to reason out before we take a photo.

#### I Hate to be the Bearer of Bad News, but . . . .

I really don't want to make the process of taking photos to be any more difficult.

Two months ago, I told you that you the colors that you (think that you) see are not necessarily the colors that end up in the photo. I told you that you need to recognize the situation, check out the (primary) light source, and consider whether you need to change any camera settings.

Now I am telling you that you need to consider the size and angle to the (primary) light source looking for real or "invisible" (caused by the flash as you take the photo) shadows, and consider whether you need to change angles or add another light source.

If, during your daily activities, you will pick a scene and look it over for these conditions, even if you don't take a photo, you will get used to making these decisions when needed.





The Rally Day raffle list is growing so everyone is encouraged to purchase tickets and arrive early for goody bags full of door prizes. Admission is free, but you may want to pre-purchase your lunch.

**V-Ps Membership**, Jeanne Vogel & Diana Florence reported 86 in attendance including 3 new members and 3 guests. We again had "choose your prize night", the person whose number was drawn was allowed to select their door prize from the great selection offered by Not Your Mama's Quilt Shop, Quilt Country, Stitched with Love, Minding my P's and Q's, Material Girl Quilt Shop or The Old Craft Store.

Quilt Plano 2017 Chairperson, Rose Davis gave a great overview of the progress being made on this monumental endeavor. Rose introduced her co-chair, Pam Crocker. This is Rose's last year to head the committee, but she reports the great group of ladies she has worked with to make this show happen are the best! There are many tables around the room where we can each sign up for various necessary tasks to help make this show a success. The show is Aug 11-12 (Fri-Sat). This show allows us to share our art with the community with several thousand visitors. There will be over 300 judged quilts and four special exhibits. This show will require about 4,200 hours of volunteer labor, so please do your share. June 8th is the entry deadline and Aug 8th from 8-1 is the ONLY turn-in time. Preview night is Aug 10th (our Aug meeting). The Raffle quilt (drawing on Sat Aug 12th at 3:30) and the Mini quilt auction are big fund raisers for the support of QGP. If your quilt is an odd shape (like a tree skirt) it was suggested to attach your quilt to a black drape (the color of our backdrop drapes) for hanging. Make the drape large enough so your quilt hangs properly and the sleeve would be across the top of your drape After a ten minute break the Quilt Show's Demonstrations began around the back of the room.
