Martha says, "I love to make quilts! I have been a passionate quilter for more than 30 years but have been sewing something just about all my life. During all those years I have made so many quilts, I can't even count them."

Before her retirement in 2008, Martha was the leader of a quilt group at her office. They made a quilt every year and raised over \$5000 a year for Toys for Tots. She has taught many informal groups of quilters at her home and has lead many block swaps. For the last several years she has taught at many local quilt shops in the Dallas area.

Martha has won a number of awards for her quilts. "Mrs. Lindberg's Neighborhood" was selected as part of the special exhibit "Text on Textiles" at the International Quilt Festival and traveled to all the IQA shows in 2011-2012. In 2014-2015, her quilt "Ruby Irish Chain" traveled with the IQA "Ruby Jubilee 40th Anniversary" special exhibit.

There will be one workshop on Saturday September 16th. Martha will teach her Wonky Dresden Neighborhood

This fun quilt is a twist on the traditional Dresden Plate block. Each blade is turned into a wonky house making this Dresden Neighborhood come to life. Every quilt will be a little different because your



creativity will come into play designing each house with a special roof, door and windows. It will be your own unique creation! Come join the fun.


Quilt Plano 2017

Yahoo! Quilt Plano 2017 is almost here!!! For all of you that have entered quilts in this year's show, you should have already received all the paperwork from Lynne Fritsche providing you all the information you need to turn your quilt in on Tuesday, August 8th. If you have not gotten that information, please let Lynne know.

Just a reminder, you will drop your quilt off at the Plano Event Center (park on the east side of the building) between 8:00am and 1pm. After that 1PM deadline our work really begins – getting all the quilts ready to be hung in time for our judges to start their work. PLEASE make sure you have your quilt at the center no later than 1PM on Tuesday.

Volunteers that will be helping with take-in will park on the east side of the build and enter through the east doors.

Starting on Wednesday, all volunteers will park on the West side of the center and follow the signs to the Hospitality room where you can check your bags and sign-in for your shifts (see map included in this month's newsletter). Please make sure and sign in and out at the center, as well you need to make sure and enter your time as you normally do to account for all your volunteer hours.



All the show shirts have been ordered. Keep your eyes out for an e-mail with instructions on how to pick them up before the show begins.

Quilt Plano 2017 – Important Dates

Quilt Plano 2017 is right around the corner! This is just a reminder of the important dates to remember:

- August 1 Withdrawal Deadline If you determine that a quilt you have entered must be withdrawn, please inform the Registration Chair, Lynne Fritsche, by Tuesday, August 1. Any entrant withdrawing a quilt after that date will not be allowed to enter next year's show.
- August 8 Quilt Turn-in Quilts are to be delivered to the Plano Event Center between 8:00am and 1:00pm on Tuesday, August 8. If you (or someone on your behalf) cannot deliver your quilt at that time, contact Lynne Fritsche to make other arrangements. If shipping your quilt, plan to have it arrive during the week before the show (July 31 – August 4).
- August 11-12 Quilt Plano 2017 Show hours are 9:00am 5:00pm Friday and Saturday.
- August 12 Quilt Pick-up Quilts are to be picked up at the Plano Event Center in the Windhaven Room (Hospitality Room) on Saturday, August 12, beginning at 6:00pm. No quilts will be released until all the quilts have been taken down and accounted for.



General Meeting Minutes

July 13, 2017

She also reminded all volunteers to park on the west side of The Plano Center and walk around the north side of the building to the hospitality room. Sign-in and check your personal effects before going to work. If you work 4 hours your admission is free. Don't forget our next meeting is Show pre-view night, 6:15 pm August 10 at The Plano Center.

VPs **Membership** Jeanne Vogel and Diana Florence expressed appreciation to Pam Wingate for making her Retreat Center available for tonight's meeting. The Quilters Guild of Plano exists to bring together people who share a love of quilts and quilting, preserve the heritage of quilting, promote the knowledge and understanding of all aspects of quilting, and provide opportunities for continuing education among those interested in the art of quilting. Together we learn from national and local quilt teachers and speakers, and share our work with each other and the community. All levels of quilters are encouraged to join us, including beginners. We are a 501 (c) 3 organization.

The Quilters Guild of Plano normally meets at **Hunters Glen Baptist Church, 4001 Custer Road**. The church is on the west side of Custer Road between Parker Road and Spring Creek Parkway. We park on the South end and enter through the South Entrance. The meetings are held in the Fellowship Hall, on the right as you enter. The Guild meets the second Thursday of Each month. Meetings start at 6:45 pm with a social time from 6:15pm to 6:45pm. Guests are always welcome at the meetings.
