
Saturday, October 14 - Workshop – Techniques in Paint and Ink

Want to join a small group? Just mark your form and we'll see that you are contact with others with the same time preference.




In addition to the 10 monthly door prizes we are having a Pot Luck Drawing in December.

Spray Basting

I spray baste ALL of my quilts – no matter how big they are. I have found that not all basting spray is alike. I've tried 3 types. There are many out there. My absolute favorite is the Tailor Spray shown below, which I bought at Joann's. It has very, very little odor, and the right amount of tackiness. A group of us basted around 50 quilts in an afternoon, twice, inside my house. No one had a headache or complained of the smell.

If you look at the ingredients they are very different than the bottle on the right, which I used once and found it to be a disaster. It contains acetone, which is highly volatile and has a terrible smell. And it sticks so strongly that if you want to move the top or back immediately after spraying, you can't. It's like super glue. Got all over our hands and make them black. Couldn't wash it off, even with soap.

I tried making my own (5 different methods – I REALLY tried!) and found that I couldn't make a usable product and even if I could, it wasn't worth the cost or the mess. I'd be happy to hear if you go down this path and find something that works!

Spray basting method

There are LOTS of YouTube videos, etc.

Laying out the quilt sandwich

- 1. Tape the backing to a flat surface, face down. Carpet, white fold-up tables, wood floor.
- 2. Make sure the back is taut (not stretched, but tight)
- Lay the batting and the top on the backing.
 A few good tips:
- Backing should be tight, batting and top should LAY on the backing. Use your hands and push the batting and quilt top down.
- Don't put your hand in the middle, press hard, and stretch the top out to the edges
- It should be called Spritz Basting, not Spray Basting. Spritz small periodic spots, not spray painting the entire surface Baste the batting to the backing
- 4. Fold top and batting over onto itself (I generally take the ends and fold to the halfway mark)
- 5. Lift the batting and top slightly, and spritz the middle 1/4 of the quilt sandwich - keep the nozzle of the bottle underneath the batting and top and "spritz" a spot of basting spray about as frequently as you would place pins if you were pin basting – about a hands width apart. No need to "SPRAY" – that's overkill – wastes money and might gum up needle (not necessarily with the good stuff, just a waste of spray)

- 6. Fold the batting and top back down. Lift the batting and top and spritz the front 1/4 section.
- 7. Go to the other side and repeat. Fold back the edge of the batting and top to the halfway mark. Hold the folded part up slightly and spritz that 1/4 of the quilt.
- 8. Fold the batting and top back down. Lift the batting and top and spritz the front 1/4 section.

Baste the quilt top to the backing

9.Repeat steps 4 through 8 lifting only the top of the quilt, i.e. basting the top to the batting.

Heat set

Why heat set? My biases – it's a final quality check to make sure the backing has no wrinkles, and I'm convinced that the basting might be more robust (who knows – never tried no heat setting). My experiences: quilted a very large quilt over 3 months, man-handled it like crazy while quilting it on a home machine, had no loss of basting integrity, not a single wrinkle on the backing or top. Won a second place ribbon on that quilt! Basted 50 quilts with friends for Community Service, stuck them in my attic for 3 months in the summer heat and didn't have a single one that didn't hold.

- 10.PRESS the quilt, don't "iron" it. The top shouldn't be "tight"

 machine quilting needs some slack. If the top is too tight,
 the back will pucker or have folds. So just PRESS the iron
 down on the quilt top to make sure there aren't any wrinkles
- 11.Better not to "iron", i.e. don't "push" the iron from the middle to the edges it will stretch the top, undo the basting, and make wrinkles in the backing when you quilt. But, I've seen it done both ways, so iron if you can't help yourself.

September 14, 2017

Sept from 9-5 at the Dallas Marathon Games Center at the corner of Alma and Parker (behind the donut shop) members will meet and try to quilt over 100! She reported helpers and quilters are needed to sign up and work.

Rose Davis, **2017 Quilt Plano Chair**, a profit of close to \$23,000! A great show and she thanked everyone who made it a success through their entries and their work, before, during and after the show..

Kaye Dunn and Valerie Salter reported 10 **Mini Quilts** have already been turned in for our 2018 show. The mini quilt auction raised \$4,630. at our 2017 show. Guidelines are on the web page. Chris Cessnum won a First Aide kit for donating a mini quilt.

Co V-P Programs, Peggy Burrell and Dena Smith reported on the upcoming workshops and speakers.

Guild Retreat Co-Chairs, Pam Walsh and Carol Long announced there are a few spaces available for the February 22-25 retreat in Denison, Texas. Cost for 2 in a room (meals, drinks and snacks included) is \$300 each. Three per room (no roll away bed) is \$251.00 and a private room is \$448. A space will be held for a \$50.00 deposit at sign-up.

V-P Guild Activities - Janet Plotkin, announced the Day Retreat at the Dallas Marathon Game Center on Oct 14-15. See our web page for more information. After a 10 minute break Pam called the meeting to order and Dena Smith introduced our speaker, Becky Goldsmith. She spoke to us about project ideas and color selection. A very helpful program. The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 pm.
