Charlotte's Workshops are Filling Up Fast! Sign Up Today!

Workshop – Friday, January 12, 2018 – Surprise Yourself! Workshop

For years, Charlotte has used her own methods for designing and cutting her kits for Let Me Surprise You! Now there is a book. This workshop will use the techniques for simple design, cutting



and sewing techniques. Using easy units and an artistic eye you will be creating your own designs as well as not needing the crazy directions often found in patterns and books. With this freedom, you can easily see how many quilts are broken down and put back together again!

Certain patterns are easier than others and using basic units you will begin to create instead of just copy. This class is full of information, real quilts and real solutions to everyday problems in quilt making. The book is not required for the class, but it sure is a great source!



Workshop – Saturday, January 13, 2018 – Let Me Surprise You! Workshop

In this fun-filled class, a kit of CUT fabrics is furnished. This is a wonderful group workshop for those that just want to sew and not have any cutting or thinking to do. This class is the most popular class Charlotte offers. It fills quickly and is a SURPRISE in more ways than one. It is a mystery type class. All kits in class are the same; there is no choice for the students. This is the type of class that works well because it lets the students have a great time plus have a successful project. It is also great for guilds where the students know each other and like to talk and don't usually get that chance in other classes. Class Kit is required and is purchased for \$100 from Charlotte in class.

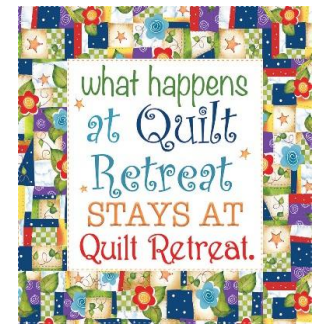

Quilt Plano 2018 is August 10-11, 2018



Quilt Plano 2018 is 8 months away, but work behind the scenes is well under way. Designing artwork and print materials, contracting with the Plano Event Center, selecting judges, registering vendors..... all of these activities and more have already begun.

Under the leadership of Donna Petrick, Rose Davis and Pam Wingate, a steering committee has completed work evaluating the positions on the show committee. As our annual Show has grown, the responsibilities placed on the Show Chair have grown, and it was time to analyze the tasks involved and develop a plan to spread responsibilities between additional positions on the committee. The result is a formal designation of the roles of the Chair, the Co-Chair (who is also the incoming Chair) and the new position of Process Coordinator. 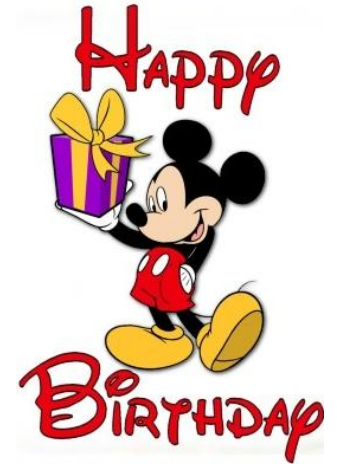

HELP WANTED! – QP 2018

Our Annual Quilt Show is our primary means of funding the programs of the Guild. Without the funds raised at the Show, the Guild could not schedule quality speakers and workshops. Without the Show Committee, there would be no Show. Ask any member who has served on Show

Committee about the fun and excitement of being involved. The Show Committee has two openings which need to be filled for 2018.

Show Co-Chair is a two-year commitment: the first year as Co-Chair, followed by one year as Show Chair. Ideally, the Co-Chair has previously served on the Show Committee. The Co-Chair shadows the Chair, attending all meetings, including those with the Plano Event Center. This provides the opportunity for the Co-Chair to observe first-hand all the activities involved in organizing the show and to develop relationships with outside providers like the Plano Center. The Co-Chair also has primary responsibility for some logistics, such as the move from the storage unit to Plano Center, working with the pole and drape vendor, and ordering volunteer charms. The Co-Chair also coordinates with the webmaster to ensure that the Show webpages are updated as needed. The Co-Chair, as does the Show Chair, needs to be available at Plano Center from Tuesday through Saturday of show week (August 7-11, 2018).

Door Prize Chair is responsible for soliciting and collecting door prizes from NON-vendors. (The Vendor Chair coordinates door prizes from our Show Vendors.) These door prizes are given out to show attendees and volunteers in separate drawings. The

obvious place to start solicitations for door prizes is with quilt shops and related businesses. However, that is not a limitation. In the past, we have had various other types of door prizes including restaurant gift cards, house plants, and grocery store and bakery goodies. Experience has shown that personal contact or telephone calls are the most successful avenues to collecting door prizes. The Door Prize Chair also maintains a list of door prize donors for recognition by listing in the Show Program.

November 9, 2017

Meeting called to Order at 7:05pm by Rose Davis
Minutes and Treasurer's Report from last month approved as published.

President's Business:

- Announced that there will be a "Best Little Market Day" at Best Little Retreat Center on Saturday, November 11. The Guild will have a table and volunteers are needed to work in one hour shifts. Please contact Pam or Rose if interested.
- Announced that Tina Connolly has resigned as VP of Media. Also, our Show Chair, Pam Crocker has resigned. Pam Walsh as co-chair will be stepping up as Show Chair, but that leaves us in need of a new co-chair. The Executive Board has divided the responsibilities of the show chair amongst 3 positions. The new position will be **Process Coordinator**. This division of tasks should reduce the work load of the Show Chair position and make the year to year transition much easier. Anyone who is interested in working on the Quilt Plano 2018 committee, please contact Rose or Pam.
- The next Board meeting will be November 27 at the Sunrise Seniors facility.

Committee Reports

Membership by Diana Florence and Jeanne Vogel:

- Announced that we would be meeting in this same room at the church until January
- Number of members present: 81
- There were 10 new members and 5 guests
- Diana announced that in the interest of safety the doors of the church will be locked by 7:30.
- In January, we will be able to meet back in the newly remodeled Fellowship Hall on the South side of the building.

Programs by Angel Hawks:

- There will be a change in fees for the upcoming workshops starting in January. For members that pay 30 days before the workshop, there will be a \$5 discount, meaning they will pay \$40. After 30 days, the amount will be \$45. And non-QGP members will pay \$55. Because you can now sign up online, payment after signup will need to be made within 10 days, otherwise, your name will be taken off and your spot may be given to someone else. 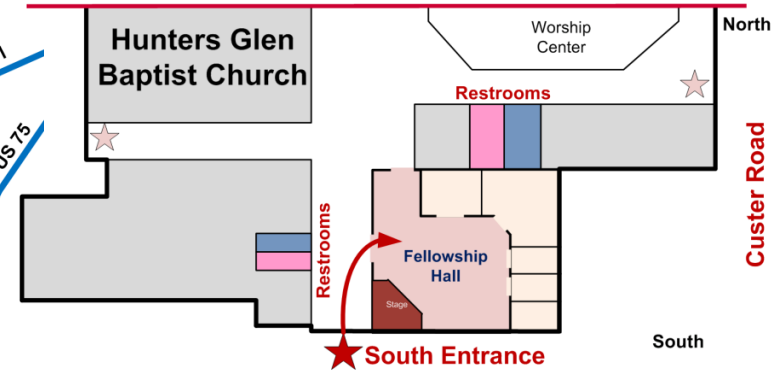
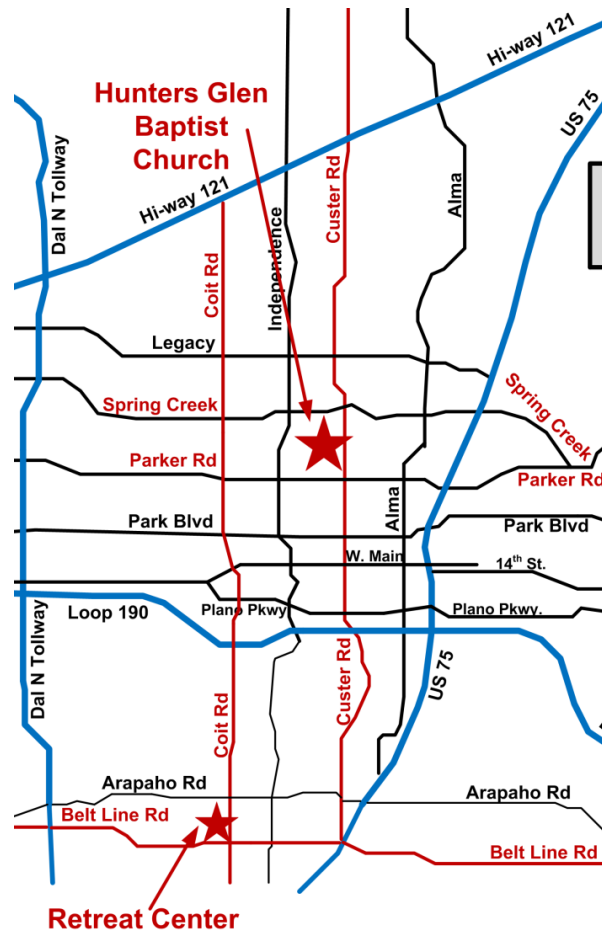
