Workshop – Friday, January 12, 2018 – Surprise Yourself! Workshop

For years, Charlotte has used her own methods for designing and cutting her kits for Let Me Surprise You! Now there is a



book. This workshop will use the techniques for simple design, cutting and sewing techniques. Using easy units and an artistic eye you will be creating your own designs as well as not needing the crazy directions often found in patterns and books. With this freedom, you can easily see how many quilts are broken down and put back together again!

Certain patterns are easier than others and using basic units you will begin to create instead of just copy. This class is full of information, real quilts and real solutions to everyday problems in quilt making. The book is not required for the class, but it sure is a great source!

Workshop – Saturday, January 13, 2018 – Let Me Surprise You! Workshop

In this fun-filled class, a kit of CUT fabrics is furnished. This is a wonderful group workshop for those that just want to sew and not have any cutting or thinking to do. This class is the most popular class Charlotte offers. It fills quickly and is a SURPRISE in more ways than one. It is a mystery type class. All kits in class are the same; there is no choice for the students. This is the type of class that works well because it lets the students have a great time plus have a successful project. It is also great for guilds where the students know each other and like to talk and don't usually get that chance in other classes. Class Kit is required and is purchased for \$100 from Charlotte in class.



February 2018 Program - Judy Steward

Judy is a quilt artist who loves to teach others about quilting and making their dream a reality. It is exciting to see their eyes light up in the moment when they realize they too can make their creation come alive under her guidance. Fabric, color, and texture inspire her as a quilt artist.

When she started quilting, there were no quilt shops in the area, nor rotary cutters, rulers, or cutting mats. Judy made quilts in the footsteps of her ancestors by hand piecing, hand appliqueing, and hand quilting. To make squares for a quilt, she traced around a piece of cardboard and then cut it out with scissors. It was time consuming and inaccurate, but she found joy in working with fabric and putting colors and textures together to create art. Each traditional quilt that she has made has helped her learn skills and techniques to use to make her art quilts.

Feb. 8, 2018 - Quilt as Desired, What Do I Desire?

Sometimes a quilt stumps us or we don't have enough experience to know what a design will look like in an area of our quilts. Judy's trunk show displays her quilts that show the choices she made and how they do or don't work as well as other options.



How to report your volunteer hours:

- Log in to the website at <u>www.qgplano.org</u> using your username and password.
- Point to the "Members" tab and click on "Report Volunteer Hours" from the dropdown list.




Under "category", choose a category for the time you spent.



The form is set up to record actual start and stop time and date for each activity. It is also set for 24 hour time (3:30pm = 15:30).

- You can enter each day's time individually or you can enter a block of time all on one day. The total time is the important part – not the exact day or exact time of day.
 - For example, if you volunteered eight hours over the course of a week, you could enter one date with a start time of 00:00 (midnight) and an end time of 08:00.
- (Optional) Enter a brief description, such as "sewing," "selling raffle tickets," "auction mini-quilt," etc. This is helpful if you can't remember whether or not you've reported something.
- Click "Submit Hours" and your latest entry will show up in the box at the bottom.
- If you see you made a mistake, you can delete the entry and start over, or you can use "Edit Hours" on the "Members" tab and change the incorrect part, and click "Chg".


