**Feb. 8, 2018 - Quilt as Desired, What Do I Desire?**

**Judy Steward**

Judy is a quilt artist who also loves to teach others about quilting and making their dream a reality. It is exciting to see their eyes light up in that moment when they realize they too can make their creation come alive under her guidance. Fabric, color, and texture inspire her as a quilt artist.

Art first captured Judy's heart at a young age. Her childhood included wonderful opportunities to make cornhusk dolls, decorate cakes, sew garments, refinish furniture and many other creative pastimes. It was fun to dream up ideas to create something unique and beautiful.

When she started quilting there were no quilt shops in the area nor rotary cutters, rulers or cutting mats. Judy made quilts in the footsteps of her ancestors by hand piecing, hand appliquéing, and hand quilting. To make squares for a quilt, she traced around a piece of cardboard and then cut it out with scissors. It was time consuming and inaccurate, but she found joy in working with fabric and putting colors and textures together to create art. Each traditional quilt that she made has helped her learn skills and techniques to use to make her art quilts.

Sometimes a quilt stumps us or we don't have enough experience to know what a design will look like in an area of our quilts. Judy's trunk show displays her quilts that show the choices she made and how they do or don't work as well as other options.

### Friday, April 13 – Broderie Perse workshop



**Broderie perse**, or **Persian embroidery**, is not actually embroidery at all, but appliqué. The motifs were carefully cut out and then stitched to the background fabric by either turning the edges under before stitching invisibly, or with a tiny, hand-worked blanket stitch – the forerunner of today's raw-edge appliqué.

Sometimes the motifs were appliquéd straight onto the background fabric, and at other times some form of paste was used to fuse the pieces to a stretched background, allowed to dry, and then stitched.

Learn this traditional appliqué style using modern techniques from the appliqué master.

Spend a day with Kathy and let her guide you as you make the loveliest of blocks. This breathtaking block can take center stage in a wall hanging or be set it into a Baltimore Album that you have started or are thinking of beginning. In this jam-packed technique class will include padded and embroidered appliqué and you will be able to try different methods for your stems and basket. We will even use the prepared edge technique with a

paper foundation that turns to fabric and is left inside! A bit of reverse appliqué; just the right amount to make this block fun and Kathy will show you how to ribbon weave the basket if you desire. The two birds flit overhead and just wait for a fabulous, fancy print to make them soar. Don't miss this exciting class!



## Community Service

As I write this newsletter article it's 24 degrees outside-perfect weather to stay indoors and quilt! It's been a busy month for community service, even through the December holidays. We delivered 32 quilts and 1 pillowcase to the agencies we serve, along with 24 cuddles to Children's Medical Center, and a variety of items to Isabel's Community Outreach. Remember to stop by the community service table at guild to pick up or drop off items at the monthly guild meeting.

The Plano guild is also very involved in making Christmas stockings for the Veterans Hospitals. Even though we just had Christmas and 1000 stockings were delivered, we work all year long to get them ready. Last month 70 stocking kits were handed out and 89 finished stockings were received. As always, there is a need for fabric and ribbon if you are cleaning out your stash. The donated fabric can be Christmas, patriotic, tone on tone, or any appropriate novelty fabric. Please give these donations directly to Martha O'Grady at the guild meeting. The VA is very appreciative of the stockings received from us.

Everyone is invited to attend the guild's Community Service Sew days. Dates for February are: Tuesday, February 13th, for Sit and Sew at Plano Sewing Center, and Saturday, February 17th, for Saturday Sewing at the Best Little Retreat Center in Texas. Just bring your sewing machine and basic sewing supplies. Visit the guild website at [QGPlano.org](http://QGPlano.org) and look under community service for more information and to RSVP. This is a great way to get involved and meet other guild members.

We have 2 on-going challenges for community service. The first is we need help to quilt the HUGE amount of completed tops is the Quilting Challenge. Simply quilt a community service quilt and return it to enter your name into a drawing. 1 quilted quilt = 1 entry. Enter as many times as you like to increase

chances of winning. The drawing will be held in September. Secondly is Kaye's pillow case challenge. Simply sew 1 pillow case each month to be donated to The Turning Point: The Rape Crisis Center of Collin County. Remember the pillow case fabric should be geared towards women or teenagers.

### Community Service: What Size Is That Quilt?

Every top made for community service is measured when it is received. The size is documented on a scrap of paper and attached to the quilt with a safety pin. We need the size to help us pick out backing: does the backing fabric need to be pieced? For binding--how many strips? And for batting size. After the quilt is completely done and it's ready to be donated, we again need to know the size to help us determine which agency it should go to. Different agencies request different size quilts. It would be VERY helpful if you are working on a community service quilt, to keep the information with the quilt during every step of the process. And using a safety pin to attach the scrap of paper keeps us from accidental pin pricks when the quilts are stacked in piles.

Thank you for all of your hard work on our community service projects!

### **Quilt Plano 2018 is August 10-11, 2018**

The annual guild Quilt Show is important because we get to share our wonderful creations and to spread the joy and excitement of quilting with quilters and non-quilters alike. However, Quilt Plano is also important for the continuation of the Guild and its mission of promoting the knowledge of quilting and providing education to those interested in quilting. The reason for this importance: **The annual Quilt Show provides the funds needed to pay for our programs, workshops, and administrative expenses.** Membership dues and workshop fees only pay for half of our expenses for Programs and Workshops. And that leaves nothing to cover the Guild's general administrative costs.



As the Show Committee, our goal is traditionally to have vendor and sponsor fees cover the expense of the Plano Event Center facility. So the biggest sources of Show profit come from the sale of admissions tickets, the Mini Quilt Auction, and the Raffle Quilt.





