The workshops for May feature Michelle Dorsey where you will create a bag. One features Screen Mesh; the other teaches you how to put in a zipper. Please stop at the Programs table at the April meeting to see the workshop samples. These are great useful bags!

June brings us a power house in the form of Patsy Thompson. Patsy does it all in the world of quilting. Many of you may know her name from the wonderful digitized designs that she sells for embroidery machines. Some of you may know that she hand dyes many of the fabrics that she uses. She will be teaching Introduction to Ruler Work for the Sit-down Quilter and Free Motion Quilting for the True Beginner. Don't let these be those classes you wish you had taken! If you have ever wanted to try quilting with rulers on your home machine June is the month for you. Patsy will even have rulers that you may borrow to use in class. You will need to have a ruler foot that fits your machine. Patsy says of the Free Motion Quilting workshop "This class is geared to creating a good foundation of free motion skills that will serve you well as you continue practicing and move on toward more challenging designs. Let me help take the fear out of free motion quilting so you can discover the fun of it".

Deb Tucker will join us for a lecture in July. If you wish to take a workshop with Deb please find her local classes at <a href="https://www.taqg.org">www.taqg.org</a> under Quilters Rally Day. She will present Become a Pattern Detective. This lecture is different from the two lectures she will present for TAQG.





We are a 501 (c) 3 organization.

The Quilters Guild of Plano normally meets at **Hunters Glen Baptist Church, 4001 Custer Road**. The church is on the west side of Custer Road between Parker Road and Spring Creek Parkway. We park on the South end and enter through the South Entrance. The meetings are held in the Fellowship Hall, on the right as you enter. The Guild meets the second Thursday of each month. Meetings start at 6:45 pm with a social time from 6:15pm to 6:45pm. Guests are always welcome at
