

We not only took in lots of items, we gave out 3 bins of quilts to be bound and 1 bin of quilts to be quilted. It is so nice to have almost everything we brought to the meeting picked up by members to complete. We are really making a dent in our backlog of quilt tops.

I look forward to seeing you all on June 14th.



https://www.facebook.com/QuiltersGuildofPlano/ and click the thumbs up icon near the top of the page under the header image.




