Ugly to behold, not anymore!

Last year we had the great pleasure of hearing a fun and inspiring lecture about color from Becky Goldsmith, of Piece O' Cake fame. Her newest and super informational book, <u>A</u> <u>Practical Approach to Color</u>, was featured in the lecture, along with great tips and advice. Some of which was easy to follow like "backgrounds play a crucial role in a quilt, choose it first." And some far harder to take advice, like "weeding" your stash often is a good idea. Becky shared some wonderful quilts and funs stories.

Many of us were fascinated by the story of Becky's Ugly Quilt Challenge. And interest led to action in the form of our own Ugly Fabric Challenge. In January, over 25 people exchanged 10 inch squares of fabrics they considered "ugly." The comments ranged as expected from dismay that someone thought it was ugly, to concurrence that yes, that one was a doozy, to delight in the variety of color, pattern, and style.

Using what we learned, or didn't, from Becky, and the tips she shared we undertook the challenge to turn the beastly into beauty.

This month will be the big reveal. We hope all 25+ of you have created your own transformative masterpiece and will join us on stage to share a brief description of your experience, and process. Please consider writing your thoughts on an index card to carry with you. I can tell you from my experience without the written words, I panic and blather on, and an index card keeps me succinct and on message.

If your masterpiece is still in the works, please bring it to the reveal and show us where you are in your journey, and then get to work, because we have been allowed space at the show to show off, and it would be swell to make a stellar showing of our challenge. On Guild night, you will need to complete the special exhibits entry form and then either (preferred) turn the quilt in at the Plano Center on the turn in day OR, get it to me prior to the show if you cannot make it to the scheduled turn in time. If you are not attending the July Guild meeting but want to include an Ugly Challenge project in the show, please find the Special Exhibit form on the Guild website and forward to Jeanne Smith or Janet Carver, their contact info is on the form. You will drop it off as above. Special Exhibit pick-up details will be announced prior to the show.

If you attended the Deborah Boschert "Captivating Compositions for Art Quilters" there will be a special installation of those pieces included with Special Exhibits. As is typical, you need to complete the special exhibit form for inclusion in the show. The special instructions are as follows:

- Each piece must have finished edges, this does not necessarily mean bound, but some finish technique,
- Each piece must have your name, your phone number, and the name of the composition on the back,
- You do not have to complete all eight compositions to be included, but four or more are required,
- All pieces must be placed into a gallon zipper bag with your name and phone number on it,

Drop off follows the same rules as all entries unless you make prior arrangement with the Special Exhibits chairs or me.

Thanks for playing along with the Ugly Challenge; I am so excited to see all your amazing work.

TAQG is The Texas Association of Quilt Guilds. Founded in 1999, the main purpose of TAQG is to share information between member guilds. This sharing of information is primarily done through six Special Interest Meetings held on the last Tuesday of the odd numbered months. The topics are selected in November of each year. There are two meetings that are the same every year. They are Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurer in January and the Speakers Forum held in November. The other meetings have topics that include topics to help member guilds stay legal, quilt shows, community service, stimulating membership and more. Typically there are surveys, a presentation and discussion of each topic. In recent years there has been information on each Special Interest meeting placed on the website at tagg.org

TAQG also holds a fund raiser called Rally Day in July of each year. In 2018 the date is July 14. Guilds take turns hosting Rally Day. Plano will be hosting again in 2019 along with Quilting Sisters of Color, McKinney Quilters Guild, Quilters Guild of Arlington, Sherman Quilt Makers, and Mesquite Quilt Guild, Inc. We hire a National/International speaker who provides two lectures in one day. There are also a silent auction, raffle, a display of member guild raffle guilts and door prizes galore! 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General Meeting Minutes

June 14, 2018

Guild President Rose Davis called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm and welcomed the members of the McKinney guild who were selling tickets for their raffle quilt.

Rose asked if there were any changes to the minutes of the last meeting or the Treasurer's report. Since there were no changes, the minutes were approved as written and the Treasurer's report was approved as published.

Donna Petrick reported that the Nominating Committee was looking for members to fill the following board positions: Secretary, VP Education, two VPs of Membership (one of which must be computer literate), and VP Programs. The Nominating Committee is also seeking members to fill non-board *Committee Chair positions of Historian, TAQG Representative, Publicity and Pre-Workshop Coordination. Job descriptions for all positions are available on the website in the Standing Rules.

Donna also reported that the animal shelters are not accepting dog beds at this time and her storage is full, so she will not be collecting dog beds until more are needed.

Melissa Bonser of the Lone Star Quilt Guild in Sulphur Springs presented information on Rally Day to be held July 14, 2018. The guest speaker and workshop leader will be Deb Tucker. Melissa encouraged members to attend Rally Day by demonstrating the Wing Tip ruler and showed examples of blocks made with other Deb Tucker rulers.

Kaye Dunn reported that the mini-quilt auction is full for the 2018 quilt show. Any additional minis that are donated will be saved for the 2019 show. Alice Payn and Erika Inglhofer won the prizes for donated minis.

Kaye also shared thank you notes received for community service donations to the Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County and the PISD School Age Parent Programs. Community Service donated 35 quilts, 30 pillow cases and 7 afghans last month. The Christmas stocking project has 1047 stockings completed, and needs small handmade gifts to include with the stockings. Community Service Sit and Sew days are held on the second Tuesday of the month at Plano Sewing Center and the third Saturday of the month at the Best Little Retreat Center. Kaye reminded members to complete the quilting challenge to be eligible for the drawing to be held in September and to remember to record their service hours.

Pam Wingate reported that seven Junior Quilters had submitted entries to the quilt show.

Sherry Worley reported that she was accepting registration for the October Workshops on vintage linens and lace to be taught by Rhonda Dort.

Pam Walsh reported that the quilt show is full with over 300 entries. About half of the entries were from non-members. Four hours of quilt show service is required for members to receive free admission to the show. Volunteer sign up will continue through next month. Members who have entries for special exhibits need to complete the entry form on the website. Mini quilts, vendor lists, demonstrations and judge biographies are also posted on the web. The room at the Plano Event Center that was previously used for hospitality will be filled this year by vendors. Our August meeting will be held in the foyer by the concession stand. The scissor sharpener at the show will offer a \$2.00 discount for members, so bring identification to the show.

Martha Grady has taken over Shelter Pet Beds (SPB's) from Donna Petrick. Anyone who wants to turn in finished SPB's, stuff to go in them, fabric, or fabric bags for them can turn them in to Martha. NO THREAD -- as a dog could choke or get tangled up in them. Folks are also encouraged to take them to their own town's shelter, and report the number of SPB's to Community Service, as well as the time spent on the website.

Martha is no longer making stocking kits. However, she is going to continue to accept finished stockings from anyone who wants to turn them in to her.

Seven members displayed completed projects to inspire us. Jeanne Vogel reported 119 members, 6 new members and 6 visitors were in attendance. Thirteen door prizes were awarded.

The business meeting adjourned at 7:25 pm. The next meeting will be July 12, 2018 at 6:45 pm.



Quilters Guild of Plano

The Quilters Guild of Plano exists to bring together people who share a love of quilts and quilting, preserve the heritage of quilting, promote the knowledge and understanding of all aspects of quilting, and provide opportunities for continuing education among those interested in the art of quilting. Together we learn from national and local quilt teachers and speakers, and share our work with each other and the community. All levels of quilters are encouraged to join us, including beginners. We are a 501 (c) 3 organization.

The Quilters Guild of Plano normally meets at **Hunters Glen Baptist Church, 4001 Custer Road**. The church is on the west side of Custer Road between Parker Road and Spring Creek Parkway. We park on the South end and enter through the South Entrance. The meetings are held in the Fellowship Hall, on the right as you enter. The Guild meets the second Thursday of each month.
