# **General Meeting Minutes**

#### July 12, 2018

Guild President Rose Davis called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm and welcomed the members of the Austin guild who were selling tickets for their raffle quilt. Rose announced that monetary gifts had been received in memory of Joan Wilson. Since Joan had donated the first die cutting machine owned by the guild (and that machine has been well used), the money will be used to purchase a new die cutting machine. The purchase will be made when the machines go on sale.

Rose asked if there were any changes to the minutes of the last meeting or the Treasurer's report. Since there were no changes, the minutes were approved as written and the Treasurer's report was approved as published.

Donna Petrick reported that the Nominating Committee had completed their nominations for Board positions. The nominees are:

There are still needs for an Historian and for Workshop Assistants.

Donna also reported that guild had donated 19 quilts, 15 pillowcases and 20 dog beds to local charities since our last meeting. The next Saturday Sit and Sew will be held on July 21. The August meeting for the Tuesday Sit and Sew group is cancelled due to the quilt show. Donna also reminded members to complete the quilting challenge to be eligible for the drawing to be held in September. Sherry Worley displayed a sample of the table runner to be made during the Monday Rally Day. She reported that she was accepting registration for the October Workshops on vintage linens and lace to be taught by Rhonda Dort.

Pam Walsh reported that volunteers were still needed for 97 open shifts at the quilt show and reminded members that four hours of quilt show service are required to receive free admission to the show. She reminded members to log in their volunteer hours on the website. Pam announced that tonight was the last chance to purchase meal tickets and reminded members to pick up their show shirts and turn in their raffle ticket stubs or unsold raffle tickets. Members are asked to park in the lot on the west side of Plano Event Center, and to leave spaces near the door for our guests. The floor plan has changed and signs will direct members to the appropriate entrance. The room at the Plano Event Center that was previously used for hospitality will be filled this year by vendors. Our August meeting will be held in the foyer by the concession stand and will have limited seating. Quilt pickup will be in what was the demo room in previous years.

Angel Hawks asked members to contact her if they are interested in volunteering for the 2019 Show Committee. She announced that the guild had received 345 submissions to the 2018 show, and the number had been pared down to 298 quilts.

Pam Wingate displayed two quilts completed by Junior quilters and reported that 7 Junior Quilters had submitted entries to the quilt show.

Janet Plotkin reminded members who attended workshops or participated in the Ugly Quilt Challenge to complete the special exhibits entry form on the website so their work can be displayed at the show. She announced that the retreat to be held on February 21-24 had 100 of 120 spaces filled. The retreat will be held at the Hilton Garden Inn in Dennison. The cost of a double room is \$300 per person.

Janet announced the "reveal" of the Ugly Quilt Challenge. Eight members showed their projects and shared the process they used to integrate the fabrics into a finished item.

During Show and Tell, eight members inspired us with their completed projects.

Jeanne Vogel announced that 98 members, 2 new members and 10 visitors were in attendance. Ten door prizes were awarded. Diana Florence told members that the newsletter would include the list of items that are collected by the church to provide food for needy children at Sigler Elementary school.

The business meeting adjourned at 7:30 pm.


