In **November** we have the talented and nationally known fiber artist, **Dani Ives**. Dani has taught hundreds of students in workshops across the United States and internationally in Canada, Italy and London. This year she has been sold out at Chicago, Washington DC, San Diego, Austin, Little Rock and also London. We are privileged to have her come to Plano, Texas. Her lecture will be on how to "Paint" with wool. Visit her website www.daniives.com to get a taste of what she creates with wool.





On Friday, November 9th, Dani's workshop is Felt with Me: Learn How to "Paint" with Wool. In the workshop you will explore the art of *painting with wool* and learn two-dimensional needle felting techniques according to each individual's taste and style. Kits (\$15 per student, paid to Dani day of workshop) will include everything you need to finish multiple projects: felting foam pad, felting needles in two sizes, various fabric for backgrounds, a 6" embroidery hoop and lots of wool. Dani will demonstrate how to transfer image to fabric, different techniques for blending colors and how to achieve fine details and various textures. Everyone can work at her/his own pace during class and Dani will provide a one-on-one assistance as desired. Come with an idea or two of something you'd like to create. Bring your reference photos on your phone or printed to a 5x7 size.

At the October meeting we will be revealing our Jelly roll projects, so don't forget to bring in what you have been working on to enter to win a new Jelly Roll!

Quilters Guild of Plano Day Retreats are moving from the Dallas Quilters Marathon location, to the Best Little Retreat Center in Texas located at Coit and Belt Line in Dallas. We will be having three day retreats as well as one day retreats. Our first one day retreat will be Friday, October 26th. Our first three day retreat will be Friday, November 30th thru Sunday December 2nd. This is a great time to get help on any guild activities or challenges, as I will be there to help you! I will also have sign up sheets available at the Activity table in the main hallway at guild meetings if you would like to sign up while there.

The holidays are coming already, can you believe it? For this year's challenge, I was trying to come up with a quick and easy project that would be easy to do. This time of year is a very busy time for most, with presents to make or shop for, so it can be hard to find time to make something for a guild exchange. Thank you Angel Hawks for giving me the perfect idea in microwaveable bowls holders! Quick and easy to make, these bowls use very little materials and are super useful! Head on

over to the website for a pdf pattern filled with lots of helpful pictures. You can find the pattern in Challenges, under the Activities tab. Just be sure that all materials are 100% cotton as they will be going into the microwave and polyester can catch fire. We will do a fun exchange at the December meeting.

Now, on to the most exciting part! To start us off with a bang, I have designed a fun Block of the Month that will feature 13 blocks over 6 months. The focus of the activity is color value, and its importance in creating a successful quilt. If you have ever sat down to sew, but then found your color choices didn't create the depth that you wanted, or the guilt appeared muddied, then you may have picked fabrics that were too close in value. This is because the value of a color, its lightness or darkness, plays a more important role in a quilt design than the actual color. When value is used well, it can create depth, add emphasis, as well as add a lot of interest to a quilt. For this quilt, you will be picking 8 fabrics to make your blocks. The block that you will be putting together each month will be the same every time. But with unique color placement within each block design, you will be able to create blocks that look strikingly different from one another. To find instructions, patterns, fabric requirements and swatch page, as well as other resources, go to the website at www.qgplano.org under the Activities tab, and click on "Challenge". I can't wait to see your blocks each month!

Using the Website

Our website has lots of information about the guild and our activities. Most of the content there does not require you to log in. However, accessing the membership directory and recording your volunteer hours both require that you log in as a member. Here is a step-by-step procedure to get you started.

How to log in to the website:

• Go to www.qgplano.org

Method 1:

- On the left side of the page in the Login area, enter your User
 ID in the first box and your password in the second box; then click Login.
- If you are a new member, your User ID and password were emailed to you when you joined. If you don't remember seeing it, check your spam folder.
- If you get an "Invalid Password" message and cannot log in, try Method 2.

Method 2:

- Click the Members Tab at the top of the page; then click Login.
- If you know your User ID and Password, fill in those boxes and click Process Login.
- If you don't know either your User ID or your password, click Forgot User Name. You'll be asked for your email address; then the system will email you with your User ID.
- When you know your User ID, but not your password, click Forgot Password. You'll be asked for your email address and User ID; then the system will email you a new temporary password. If you don't see the email right away, remember to check your spam folder.
- If you still cannot log in, send an email to webmaster@qgplano.org for help.

 Once you have successfully logged in, please change your password – whatever you want it to be, something that you can remember (but not <u>password!</u>). It is not case sensitive.

How to change your password:

- Log in to the website.
- Click on the Members tab and choose Change Password.
- Fill in the boxes with your current password and the new password you have chosen; then click Change Password.
- You will receive an email notice that your password has been changed.

How to report your volunteer hours:

- Log in to the website at www.qgplano.org.
- Click the Members tab, then Time Management, then Report Volunteer Hours.
- Under Category, choose the category for the time that you spent.
- You can enter each day's time individually or you can enter a block of time all on one day. The total time is the important part. For example, if you volunteered eight hours over the course of a week, you can enter today's date with a start time of 00:00 (midnight) and an end time of 08:00.
- (Optional) Enter a brief description, such as "sewing," "selling raffle tickets," "auction mini-quilt," etc. This is helpful if you can't remember whether you've reported something.
- Click "Submit Hours" and your latest entry will show up in the box at the bottom.
- If you see that you made a mistake, you can delete the entry and start over, or you can go to Edit Hours from the Members/Time Management tab and change the incorrect part, then click Chg.
