

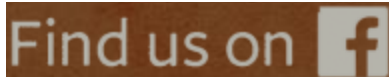

November Program

In **November, Dani Ives** will present a lecture: **Journey into Painting with Wool: My Story and Process**. Dani comes to us from Northwest Arkansas and is a self-taught fiber artist and founder of Good Natured Art. She says that “we’ll explore the art of Painting with Wool and learn lots of two-dimensional needle felting techniques that you’ll be able to apply to your own tastes and styles. Kits (\$15 per student, paid to Dani the day of workshop) will include everything you need to finish multiple projects: felting foam pad, felting needles in two sizes, various fabric for backgrounds, a 6” embroidery hoop and lots of wool.”

During her workshop on Friday, November 9th, Dani will demonstrate how to transfer image to fabric, different techniques for blending colors and how to achieve fine details and various textures. Everyone can work at her/his own pace during class and Dani will provide one-on-one assistance, as needed. **Come with an idea or two of something you’d like to create.** Bring your reference photos on your phone or printed to a 5x7 size.

If you have any questions about or need help choosing the project email Dani at hello@daniives.com. Lastly, everyone taking the workshop will get FREE access to Dani Ives’ online felting course **Felt With Me** (\$65 value). This course will provide additional projects, lessons and will be a refresher of the workshop.

This is a call for Volunteers - we are looking for new members that want to get involved yet want a safety net. We are looking for Volunteers to Co-Chair a few committees to learn about the Guild, the Show and to help your fellow members pull off this huge project.

Co - Show Chair - this person will work closely with the Show Chair for 2019 and then take the helm for the 2020 Show - it is a shadow position with the realization they will be in charge the next year.

Raffle Quilt - work with all the local shops, guilds, community events to bring the quilt to these places and sell tickets - goal is to sell out \$5000 worth of tickets - this person/small group has to be willing to either take the quilt themselves or get sign-ups for others to take it. They are also responsible for getting tickets to all the Members and collecting all raffle monies.

Registration Co-Chair (need 2nd of 2 positions)- this person will work with Donna Petrick to learn the ins and outs of how to advertise that we are taking entries, doing a database of all quilt entries and laying out the show floor by the number of entries that we have. They are responsible for the intake and outtake of quilts and to put them where they will be hung by the Set-up committee.

Signs - Responsible for hanging all quilt entry signs, vendor signs, row signs and ensuring all spelling is correct and timely - this is a sitting job at a computer/printer but is time sensitive and this person should work well under time constraints.

Special Exhibits (need 2 Co-Chairs) Chair/Small Group - each year this Chair picks a person, category or type of quilting to "Showcase". This is a great position for a small group - you will be responsible for collecting the quilts and working with registration to lay out the floor plan while getting all the individual quilt information to the Signs Chair.

Volunteers - responsible for ensuring all volunteer slots are filled for the Wednesday - Saturday of the show for each Chair - this year we will be using an online scheduling system so this person will need to learn how to set up the times and jobs in the software and remind and check in and check out all volunteers. They will also need to record the volunteer hours, order pins and be at the show to oversee all Volunteers.

But don't worry, I've got a quick project for that special someone on your list that has everything. Microwaveable bowl holders are quick and easy to make, use very little materials, and are super useful! We will be making and exchanging these at the December meeting, so make up a cute bowl holder, or maybe even a pair of them, and bring them in a cute gift bag in December! You can find the pattern in Challenges, under the Activities tab. Just be sure that all materials, including thread and batting, are 100% cotton as they will be going into the microwave and polyester can catch fire.

It's now month two for our Quiltmakers Puzzle Block of the Month! Last month I revealed blocks one and two, and I have already seen some of you working on them while at retreats, and boy are they beautiful! At the December meeting, bring in your finished blocks and we will have a big reveal, and I will also be revealing blocks three and four. If you are new or haven't yet heard about our Block of the Month, this challenge focuses on color value, and its importance in creating a successful quilt. You will be working with only 8 fabrics to make your blocks. The blocks that you will be putting together each month will be the same every time, but with unique color placement within each block design, you will be able to create blocks that look strikingly different from one another. Quiltmakers Puzzle Block of the Month Challenge

This 6 month challenge consists of 13 "identical" blocks. All use the same 8 fabrics. The focus of this challenge is value (lightness or darkness), and its importance in creating a successful quilt. Value can play an important role in a quilt design. When value is used well, it can create depth, add emphasis, as well as add a lot of interest to a quilt.

For this quilt, you will pick 8 fabrics to use in your blocks. The block will be the same pattern every time, but with unique color placement within each block design, you will be able to create blocks that look strikingly different from one another.

Below are a couple of example blocks.



Soup Bowl Cozy Challenge and Exchange

The December challenge will be microwaveable bowl holders. Quick and easy to make, these bowls use very little materials and are super useful! Just be sure that all materials are 100% cotton, as they will be going into the microwave and polyester can catch fire. Bring in your bowl in a cute gift bag at the December meeting and we will have a fun gift exchange!

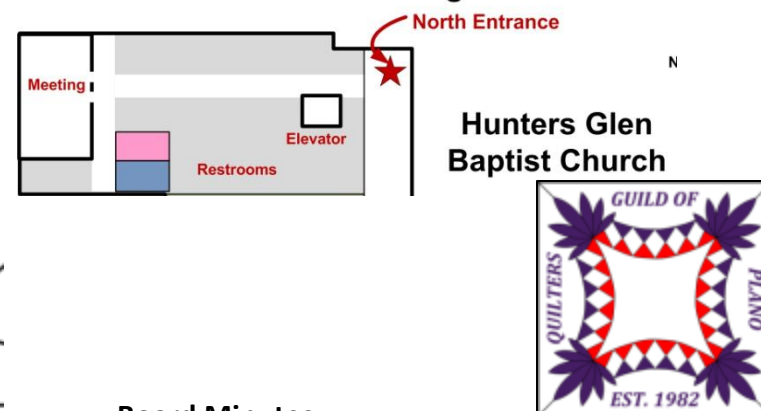
