Get ready for 2019 to have a variety of guest speakers and workshops to meet

January welcomes Ann Loveless who is a native of Frankfort, Michigan which is located on the shore of Lake Michigan. Ann's inspiration and designs come from nature and the beautiful lakes and woods of Northwest and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Ann works from photographs and develops her designs directly onto cotton batting randomly cutting and placing pieces. Her techniques include "Fabric Mosaic" (fusible appliqué), "Impressionistic" (layered fabrics under black tulle) and "Collage" (fusible appliqué). All three techniques involve free motion machine stitching. Ann will present a program on Thursday, January 10th: Landscape Art Quilts.

On Friday, January 11th, Ann will teach a workshop titled "Lake Collage". This is a Lake Michigan beach scene with birch trees and other trees flanking the sides along with dune grass and sparkling water.

Ann will provide specialty fabrics to share and a photo to work from.







Spray Basting Day

Guild members, Monica Hendewerk and Barbara Collins are at it again to organize a "spray basting day" on Wednesday, Jan 9th, 10:00am till about 2 or 3:00 with a bring-your-own lunch break at noon. We only need about 6 people (because Monica and Barbara are working too). This group meets about twice a year, gets donation quilts, batting and backing from Community Service, and spray bastes them at Monica's house; then Community Sew makes them available at the Guild meetings for members to take home and quilt at their leisure.

Large tables are clamped together and put on risers (no crawling on the floor), and we use a non-toxic spray baste. Even with 4 people spritzing, there is no smell to attack your senses. We like to have 2 pressers, 4 spray basters, 1 to trim excess fabric/batting, and 1 to fold neatly, count and bag. We even rotate jobs when someone gets tired of doing a job. Our goal is to baste 50 quilts, which is an easy goal; we have pushed ourselves to do 77 at one spray basting day.

Hi Everyone -

We are still in need of a few chair positions - if you would like to volunteer please contact Julie Brooks, <u>icjules@yahoo.com</u> or call her at 972-978-8780.

Co - Show Chair - this person will work closely with the Show Chair for 2019 and then take the helm for the 2020 Show - it is a shadow position with the realization they will be in charge the next year.

Raffle Quilt - work with all the local shops, guilds, community events to bring the quilt to these places and sell tickets - goal is to sell out \$5000 worth of tickets - this person/small group has to be willing to either take the quilt themselves or get sign-ups for others to take it. They are also responsible for getting tickets to all the members and collecting all raffle monies.

Signs/Ribbons (need 2 Co-Chairs) - Signs is responsible for hanging all quilt entry signs, vendor signs, row signs and ensuring all spelling is correct and timely - this is a sitting job at a computer and printer but is time sensitive and this person should work well under time constraints. Orders all the ribbons and has a volunteer team to hang them on Thursday; they have to check and double check winners/ribbons against a list.

Special Exhibits (need 2 Co-Chairs) - Chair/Small Group - each year this Chair picks a person, category or type of quilting to "Showcase". This is a great position for a small group - you will be responsible for collecting the quilts and working with registration to lay out the floor plan while getting all the individual quilt information to the Signs Chair

Volunteers - responsible for ensuring all volunteer slots are filled for the Wednesday - Saturday of the show for each Chair - this year we will be using an online scheduling system so this person will need to learn how to set up the times and jobs in the software and remind and check in and check out all volunteers. They will also need to record the volunteer hours, order pins and be at the show to oversee all Volunteers.


Guild Activities





The Quilters Guild of Plano exists to bring together people who share a love of quilts and quilting, preserve the heritage of quilting, promote the knowledge and understanding of all aspects of quilting, and provide opportunities for continuing education among those interested in the art of quilting. Together we learn from national and local quilt teachers and speakers, and share our work with each other and the community. All levels of quilters are encouraged to join us, including beginners. We are a 501 (c) 3 organization.

The Quilters Guild of Plano normally meets at **Hunters Glen Baptist Church, 4001 Custer Road**. The church is on the west side of Custer Road between Parker Road and Spring Creek Parkway. We will be meeting at the north end of the church again — where we met last year. There is parking around the north side building and a large parking lot across Pleasant Valley Drive. Enter the double doors on the north side. Immediately to the right is a set of stairs and an elevator.
