In January, Ann Loveless will present a lecture titled Landscape Art Quilts. Her art quilts reflect the beauty of the snowcapped mountains, glistening streams, lakes, golden aspen trees and wild flowers.

Friday, January 11th Workshop:

"Lake Collage" is a Lake Michigan beach scene with birch trees and other trees flanking the sides along with dune grass and sparkling water.

We will make a 10" x 14" beach scene landscape art quilt. Working from a photograph (Ann will provide), we will cut and fuse batik and cotton fabrics for background. Then add linen, silk, yarns, metallic and other non-traditional quilting fabrics for added texture. Finally, we will free-motion machine quilt with various threads.

Guild Activities



My goal is to have an exhibit at the 2019 Show to display our beautiful work and provide the public with an example of some of the activities that we provide. 
The meeting was adjourned at 7:04.
