I love going to the mail box. It's like opening a present. You're never sure what's in it or if you're going to like it. Ok, I know most of the contents will be junk mail and there can always be bills to pay but occasionally there will be that rarest of "treasures", a personal card or letter.

Guild Activities

It is now February; can you believe it? Only one more month and it will be springtime, my favorite time of year! Things start to turn green and the weather is perfect. There's lots of rainy days to stay in and sew and spring cleaning can begin! While that last part may not sound like a "fun" thing, it sure is a part of having a happy and functioning home. Going through all of the things that you have collected throughout the year and making tough decisions, or organizing that corner you have neglected can seem like an awful project.

But cleaning up and clearing out can have a wonderful affect on your mood and outlook! So here is my challenge to you: Let's get a head start on spring cleaning by tackling our sewing areas. Yes, I know it sounds like a daunting proposition, but I promise that you will come out of it feeling accomplished, and maybe even a little inspired. My advice to you is start making your list of what to pack, and once you choose your projects, cut them out and kit them up so you can show up and start sewing. If you are taking the spring-cleaning challenge, this is the perfect time to start setting things aside that need to be packed for retreat. Stocking Report

I gave out 205 stockings to be completed and received 53 finished stockings toward our October goal of 1000. I was so very pleased with all the stockings that y'all made last year. Some of you went above and beyond and made stockings from your own stash! These were consistently the most beautiful of all.

If there is something wrong with a kit, I am sorry. I make a lot of mistakes. If it is something that can be fixed easily, thank you for doing that. If it cannot be fixed, just bring it back, and we will try again. If you have taken a kit and have discovered that you will not be able to finish it, please feel I free to bring it back. That is totally okay, as someone else would love to do it.

Shelter Pet Beds

I have taken 53 shelter pet beds to various shelters and rescue societies. I took 22 to the Sachse animal shelter, and she was happy to receive them, and 30 to Wylie. I am trying to "spread the love" and take our beds to different places. I have found several rescue societies that would love to have beds to give to fostering homes.

I encourage you to take beds to the shelter of your choice, or to a group that rescues. Be sure to log your hours, and notify Community Service.

To make a bed, simply make a "sack." I like to fold the fabric selvage to selvage and stitch the two cut sides. This leaves the selvages at the opening. Turn the sewn seams to the inside. Place in a waste basket as a "liner." Fill about 2/3 full of scraps, and sew it shut. I like to straight stitch a seam, then flip and zigzag the same seam to add sturdiness.

Another idea is pants legs. Even easier simply to sew the two ends! This makes a smaller bed, perfect for kittens and puppies as well as the smaller breeds.

The Inn is Moving

The Samaritan Inn will relocate to its new homeless center in early February. The Samaritan Inn is currently located at 1710 N. McDonald St., McKinney. Ground was broken on the new residential building and pavilion in June 2015. The new center will serve 200 individuals per night and will be located at 1514 N. McDonald St. This is the first of four phases that will eventually house 800.

The Samaritan Inn is the only homeless shelter in Collin County and provides a comprehensive homeless program. Currently, approximately 160 people sleep at the Inn, 60 of which are children, according to the company's website. www.thesamaritaninn.org

- The Quilt Guild of Dallas was visiting. Although they didn't have the raffle quilt with them they had a picture of it and were selling raffle tickets.
- Members were asked to sign up for the day retreats. Dates and times may be found on the web site.
- **TAQG:** Sherry Worley announced that new member Jeanne Fletcher, has accepted the position of our representative at the TAQG meetings.
- Sherry reported that Plano is the main guild for sponsoring TAQG Rally Day this year. Sherry is Chair for this event and members were told that they would have many volunteer opportunities. Pam Holland is the speaker. The first of February will start sign-ups for classes that will be held the 2 days prior to the meeting and 2 days after the meeting. The actual Rally Day is July 13th

Committee Reports:

Community Service: Linda Neal and Kaye Dunn

It's January and the 2019 Raffle Quilt needs to be made. The members were asked to pick up a kit during the break and after the meeting. The kits include red and white fabric. The block may be made in any design and size at the discretion of the maker. The blocks are due on or before April 11th. Members were asked to put on the back of the block the name of the block and the maker. Hand or machine appliqué are acceptable but not red work. Any leftover fabric needs to be returned in the plastic bag with the block. The time that is

needed to make the block may be entered on the website toward hours for the Presidential Volunteer Service Award under Community Service. The blocks will be combined to make the 2019 Raffle Quilt. Left over blocks may be made into a companion quilt. All levels of blocks will be accepted. Instructions for making the blocks are on the website.

- There were 46 quilts, 95 cuddles and 35 pillowcases turned in from the last general meeting.
- Last year 327 quilts were completed for distribution to our community projects. Kaye challenged the members to break that record and assist in completing quilts for this following year by attending a Sew Day, completing a Birthday Quilt, piecing a top from a kit provided or from one's own stash, quilting or binding a quilt.

The meeting was adjourned for a break with speaker Ann Lovelace to follow.


