TAQG RALLY DAY 2018 - Admission Tickets



The Kathy Dunigan Academy of Applique

Kathy Dunigan is one of our many local talented quilters. After I had quilted for awhile and started to develop an interest in applique, I kept hearing Kathy's name. I finally discovered a class at Blue Ribbon Quilt Shop in Wylie that she was teaching. Since that discovery, I have attended several of her classes and listened while she spoke of her Academy. I just didn't think it was for me—an entire week—oh my. But this year, I took the bait and ran with it. I managed to sign up for three days of classes, while a friend I met at the Houston quilt show signed up for every event. I got to live the entire week through her. It was a wonderful learning experience.

The first day I entered the hotel, coffee and pastries were waiting. I signed in, got my goody bag, and found my classroom. My first class was with Sharon Schamber "Extraordinary Embroidery". Sharon is one of those people that totally involves herself in every aspect of quilting. She must have a day for dyeing fabrics, a day for embroidery, a day for applique, a day for piecing, and a day for creating. Time flew by. I was with Sharon for two days and practiced her magic. Kathy's applique technique is very similar to hers, but Sharon does embroidery and applique at the same time. I loved the technique. Her patterns--designed by her--are flawless and created so that you have no fabric on turns. Yes, I know, it sounds impossible.

The last day I was there, I had a class with Linda Neal—another local talent from McKinney. She was teaching "Elegant English Paper Piecing". A completely different personality from Sharon, Linda was all about fun. She had this quirky colorful border fabric for us to fussy cut to make flowers with pizazz.

Didn't know I could do that. It was fun. The mindless basting of the fabric to the tiny hexagons and whip-stitching them together was painless. I'm determined to someday make a quilt with 50,000 hexagons—of course I plan to use the 3/8 inch. It was such a fun class. I sat next to my friend from Waco and in front of a woman from Alaska. Just like Houston, the classes were filled with people from many states and countries other than Texas. If you just thought there was Texas, you were wrong.

Joanne told me about the bus trip on Monday thinking I would have been to the places, but no, I had missed out. Also, she had a button she made at a free night class—in case you ****didn't get enough quilting during the day. They had a lecture and social on Thursday night and Saturday was "Texas Two Step" Farewell Buffet, Show and Tell, and Goodbyes. All in all, `have to say this was a pretty good academy. I definitely will be back next year. Thank you Kathy for all your hard work.

I have to mention that our own Sherry Worley was there with other vendors selling her hand-dyed fabrics. Also Dallas, Plano, Mckinney, and Arlington had raffle quilts you could purchase tickets for. Absolutely beautiful quilts from these guilds.

A Little Something Special From Helen

If you aren't familiar with Helen Frost, you are missing out. Helen is the co-author of eleven books including *Grand Endeavors: Vintage Arizona Quilts and Their Makers*, the Arizona state quilt project publication. She has taught at guilds

across the country 2001, she and her honored as Women Quiltmaking at Market and Festival Helen was inducted Quilter's Hall of Fame

in 2009. She continues to explore her favorite quilt designs and cannot begin to count how many Lone Star and Nine-Patch quilts she has made! Helen lives in Tucson, Arizona.

I was privileged to take a class with her in Houston at last year's festival. She has the most fun workshops. At the end of class she gave us a present that I loved. It was a handmade pincusion that slips into your spool of thread. I've always stuck my pins into the fabric or into the thread, but that's not so good. This is the perfect solution to keeping up with your pins. Helen was kind enough to send me the directions for making these pincushions and I'm sharing that with you now.

Spool Flower

Fabrics:

Cut 1 fabric circle 2 $^{1}/_{8}$ " in diameter. Since silk flowers vary in size, do a test to make sure the center is in proportion to the flower. You can find flowers at Hobby Lobby, Michael's or JoAnn's.

Other supplies: Silk flower, heavy thread for gathering, 2 ¹/₈" golf tee, Tacky glue, bug button (optional)

Sewing:

- Pull the flower off the stem. Remove the center by putting the stem on a hard surface and pushing the petals down. Glue the layers of petals together, offsetting them as necessary.
- 2. Make small running stitches ¹/₄" from the edges of the fabric circle. Wrap one tail of thread over the other 3 times.
- 3. Pull the thread tails to slightly gather the circle. Stuff the fabric circle firmly and pull the thread ends to gather. The raw edges should just touch in the center. Knot securely.
- 4. Sew a bug button to the stuffed circle before gluing it to the petals.
- 5. Put glue on the petals and add the stuffed center. Place in a plastic egg carton to keep the petals in place and let dry.
- 6. Glue to a golf tee. Hold in place until the glue sets.

Have fun and hope you enjoy yours as much as I have mine.
